Information Sharing Demonstration

The Department of Homeland Security, Science and Technology Directorate, Integrated Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Explosive (ICBRNE) Pilot Program participated in an information sharing demonstration for the Program Manager for the Information Sharing Environment. This successful demonstration integrated CBRNE data to and from Los Angeles Public Safety, Customs and Boarder Protection, the Kansas City Terrorism Early Warning Center and the DNDO Joint Analysis Center.

The ICBRNE program was part of an end-to-end solution that captured instrument data from a large variety of dissimilar fixed, mobile and hand-held sensors, routed the data through multiple network connections where it was captured and integrated into NIEM conformant standards. This structured data was managed and routed through the DNDO Mission Critical Messaging Program where it delivered to other systems in their familiar format.
